AA once a week

Fathering Program once a week

Men's Chemical treatment 2 times a week

Life skills classes once a week

Sunday church service

Bible study twice a week

Recreation (1 stationary machine w/ 4 stations shared by up to 8 guys.) 7 dys/wk

Library/book exchange 1 day a week

One on one minister visits 2 days a week

WOMEN

Bible study 3 times a week

Women's chemical treatment once a week

Addiction's once a week

Life Skills classes once a week

Recreation (1 stationary machine w/ 4 stations shared by up to 8 women) 7 dys/wk

Library/book exchange 1 day a week

One on one minister visits 2 days a week

Programs we supervise

Haircuts one day a week. (Hair is cut in the Recreation/canteen room.)

Pre-COVID/low staffing levels we offered BINGO one day a week

Pre-COVID/low Staffing levels we offered corn hole and bowling one day a week.

GED is going to be run through an online program, but proctored by us.

Work release is for inmates with jobs before they get arrested that are allowed by the courts to work when they are in custody. We supervise them and make sure they are going to work when they are supposed to.
