Approved Mental Health Bonding Resolution

The Board, by adoption of its Consent Agenda, approved the Mental Health Bonding Resolution:

Affirming Beltrami County's support for state capital investments for regional behavioral health crisis program facilities and permanent supportive housing for people with behavioral health needs.

WHEREAS, Minnesota's mental health continuum of care is creating harmful and expensive gaps underdeveloped, in an individual's treatment; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota's mental health system does not have the capacity to consistently respond to the needs of individuals in crisis with appropriate treatment options; and

WHEREAS, individuals experiencing a mental health crisis are often diverted to jails and other facilities ill-equipped for their care while awaiting inpatient treatment; and

WHEREAS, individuals ready for discharge from inpatient treatment can be detained at inpatient facilities because there is a scarcity of supportive housing units to transition to; and

WHEREAS, the gaps in Minnesota's mental health system are not only damaging to individuals and their families, but also result in an inefficient use of taxpayer dollars; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota has an opportunity to improve its mental health continuum of care through investments in new permanent supportive housing and regional behavioral health crisis program facilities; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, Beltrami County supports state capital investments for regional behavioral health crisis program facilities and permanent supportive housing for people with behavioral health needs.

Approved Resolution of Support for Local License Centers The Board, by adoption of its Consent Agenda, approved the Resolution supporting the maintenance of local license bureaus/centers:

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota established a deputy registrar network to provide our citizens with motor vehicle titling and registration services, including driver license transactions; and,

WHEREAS, deputy registrars are required to operate as agents on behalf of the State of Minnesota without compensation from the State for the services they offer; and,

WHEREAS, in 1949, the State of Minnesota established in statute a user-based filing fee on motor vehicle and driver license transactions to be retained by the deputy registrar to defray all their costs to provide this localized service to our citizens for the State; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota now receives over \$1 billion annually in state fees and taxes collected through the deputy registrar network; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota has now shifted substantial clerical and auditing responsibilities onto the deputy registrar network due to the State's conversion to their new MNLARS (Minnesota Licensing and Registration System) program; and,

WHEREAS, the new MNLARS regimen is now documented to have multiple shortcomings which have severely strained normal deputy registrar

operations with longer processing times that greatly limit their typical volume of daily business; and,

WHEREAS, other MNLARS shortcomings have frequently forced deputies to conduct "no-(filing) fee" services for customers which acerbates the deputy business model; and,

WHEREAS, deputy registrar offices are now forced to invest in additional staff, office equipment, and more space to meet customer demand due to the MNLARS conversion; and,

WHEREAS, the filing fee revenue no longer covers the operational costs to maintain deputy registrar offices such that many local government-based deputies are seeking local property tax subsidies and private operators are applying for lines of credit to stave off complete closure,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that ____(insert name of city or county)_ calls upon the State Legislature and our Governor to enact legislation in 2018 to provide deputy registrars with proper compensation by reallocating from existing state fee structures or other appropriate filing fee adjustments to ensure their valued service and continued presence remains in our local community to serve our citizens and the State.

- Judy Dvorak, resident on Lake Beltrami Inquired as to how the County would go about enforcement and how citizens would know if they are compliant. Mr. Rud stated that there are currently only a small number of compliance issues, and the landowners have already been contacted.
- Curtis Hunt, resident on Long Lake stated his support for local enforcement of the law rather than State enforcement.

Commissioner Anderson closed the public hearing.

Whereas, The Beltrami County Board of Commissioners reviewed the property owner's application for repurchase and determined that allowing the repurchase will correct an undue hardship.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners hereby approves the Application for Repurchase of Forfeited Lands.

Approved Resolution for Private Sale of Tax Forfeited Property The Board, by adoption of its Consent Agenda, approved the resolution supporting the private sale of a small portion of tax forfeited land at estimated market value to resolve an encroachment situation:

WHEREAS, Chapter 282.01 to 282.12, Minnesota Statutes 1941, as amended, provides for the classification and sale of such lands forfeited to the State for delinquent taxes, and whereas such classification has been made by the County Board and the classification and sale have or by the governing body of the municipality in which they lie in so far as the lands located within said town or municipality are concerned; and,

WHEREAS, The County Board has made appraisal of such lands as provided by law, and a list of such lands has been filed with the County Auditor for the purpose of offering such lands for sale at not less than their appraised value; and,

WHEREAS, Said .40-acre parcel, located in the NW ¼ of the SW ¼ of Section 2-T148N-R31W, was approved for sale by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Beltrami County Tax-Forfeited Sale Review No. 04-18-01; and,

WHEREAS, this rectangular shaped .40-acre tax-forfeited parcel is encroached upon with a house and driveway, and,

WHEREAS, The County Board is by law designated with authority to provide for the sale of such lands on terms and whereas the County Board has considered the advisability of selling on terms and has considered the accessibility of such lands, their proximity to existing public improvements and the effect of their sale and occupancy on the public burdens; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That such parcels shall be sold on the following terms, to-wit: That all sales shall be paid in full in cash at the time of the purchase. Special assessments and the appraised price of any standing timber or timber products must be paid for in cash at the time of the sale; and in the case any parcel of land bearing standing timber or timber products is sold at public auction for more than the appraised value, the amount bid in excess of the appraised value shall be allocated between the land and the timber in proportion to the respective original appraised values thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That all purchasers of land shall pay 3 percent surcharge of the total sale price to be paid into the state assurance account as provided by Chapter 383, Laws of 1969, a state deed fee of \$25.00, a deed filing fee of \$46.00, and a state deed tax equal to the greater of \$1.65 or 0.33% of the basic sale price.

WHEREAS, the Beltrami County Natural Resource Management Department realized minimal economic benefits by being dual certified; and

WHEREAS, the Beltrami County Natural Resource Management Department will remain a member of the Minnesota Counties Sustainable Forestry Cooperative; and

WHEREAS, BE IT RESOLVED that Beltrami County withdraw from FSC® forest certification and retain SFI® forest certification effective October 1, 2018; and

WHEREAS, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that loggers with timber permits will be given the option to turn back the permit - at no cost - now that the wood is no longer FSC® certified.

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Beltrami County Natural Resource Management Department will continue to operate under the guidelines set forth in the Beltrami County Forest Management Plan, and follow the Forest Management Guidelines developed by the Minnesota Forest Resource Council.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lucachick, and seconded by Commissioner Winger, to approve the Resolution to withdraw from FSC Forest Certification and retain SFI Forest Certification. Motion carried 3:1. Commissioner Olson voted: No.

CSC Building Space Needs Follow-up

Anne Thomas, Economic Assistance Division Director, reviewed the project progress since it was approved by the Board in the fall of 2017. The building is 22 years old and Health & Human Services Departments housed in the CSD Building, has grown from 109 to 156 employees. Two major needs were identified 1)to provide better access to services for clients and 2) to provide better space needs for staff. The new design will provide for centralized intake on the second floor of the building and redesign/rearranging department areas to provide flexibility for growth and expansion.

The County portion of the project would come from Capital Improvement Funds. That fund was established as a source for funding for the projects that only need to be done on a very occasional basis. Source of the funding is a portion of the State Payment in Lieu of Taxes annual revenue. There is ample funding to cover the cost of the remodel.

A motion was made by Commissioner Winger, and seconded by Commissioner Olson, to approve the Community Services Center Remodel Project and use a projected \$148,873 of Capital Improvement Funds. Unanimously carried.

Commercial Solid Waste Hauler License Revocation

Commissioner Lucachick invited Terry Schmidt, Owner of TC Lighting and Recycling of Bemidji, to address the Board with his explanation of the circumstances around the recommended revocation of his Hauler License for by-pass material and temporary events of 7 days or less.

Mr. Schmidt and his Office Manager, addressed the Board. It was established that Mr. Olson had spoke to Mr. Schmidt indicating that his dumpsters must be lined and covered due to the fact that

they would get used for municipal solid waste (MSW) regardless of whether they were placed at BSU for other materials during move in/move out events, as has happened in prior years during this event. Mr. Schmidt was told by the BSU Facilities Supervisor, that he did not have to line and cover his dumpsters and that BSU staff would monitor the situation. Upon inspection by the County Solid Waste Department, the dumpsters were receiving MSW and were not lined or covered as requested and required by law.

Workforce Impact Program

Economic Assistance Division Director, Anne Lindseth, provided a program update on the Beltrami County Workforce Impact program.

Ms. Lindseth reviewed the Public Assistance Programs in Beltrami County and their income and work requirements. There are over 50 different public assistance programs, broken into three catagories: Medical, Food and Cash support. All of the Medical and Food support programs have no work requirements.

Of the Cash programs, only MFIP/DWP has work requirements as well as income guidelines and many exemptions. There are very strict and specific Federal and State guidelines that must be followed to be eligible for these programs.

Top five barriers to successful employment data gathered from WFI participants were:

1. Education & work skills

2. Housing

- 3. Social supports not available
- 4. Transportation
- 5. Legal issues

Workforce Impact Program Director, Brian Ophus reviewed the Workforce Impact Program process and procedures, and how they help clients overcome these barriers. He presented several real life scenarios of how the program has worked for individual clients.

Mr. Ophus also included a snapshot of current statistics of the program and a list of over 30 employers who are participating in the program:

WHEREAS, MS Ch. 297H.02 requires certain political subdivisions to identify by Resolution a Market Price for solid waste management tax purposes if the political subdivision subsidizes the cost of Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) disposal at a facility, or directly bills for organized collection of MSW on property tax statements; and

WHEREAS, the political subdivision will be liable for any Solid Waste Management Tax (SWMT) based only on the Market Price identified by Resolution; and WHEREAS, Market Price is defined in State Statute as the "lowest price available in the area"; and

WHEREAS, Beltrami County has researched and identified the lowest viable Market Price available in the area; and

WHEREAS, the County of Beltrami declares the Market Price for all MSW generated in Beltrami County during CY 2018 to be \$35.32 per ton, based upon the lowest price available in the area. Beltrami County's identified Market Price includes both the cost per tonmile for transportation and the cost per ton for disposal, assuming disposal at the Gwinner Landfill. All costs were calculated using current hauling and tip fee rates offered in the region.

The daycare shortage is a statewide issue and becomes an employment issue and economic development challenge, not to mention the many social complications. The group is committed to addressing some, if not all of the needs.
- Airport Commission. The Airport Authority, includes City Council and County Board members and an at-large Chair. The City has given unofficial authority for the Commission to reappoint the Chair to another three-year term. Commissioners raised concerns about following policy and procedure. General consensus of the Board is that if there is a policy in place, to follow it and go through the appointment process.
- Developing the Board Agenda. An outside agenda request was distributed to members of the Board. Ms Mack indicated that she would continue the process of providing the individual Board members with requests to be on the agenda for issues that are not standard county issues and will not place them on an agenda unless directed by the Board.

The absolute cost driver in county government is staffing. With the exception of the cost of building and improving roads, our departmental expenses are predominately budgeted for wages and benefits. For this reason, the county takes a very careful and conservative approach to adding or replacing staff. The budget proposed by the Budget Committee to the County Board, and included in this Budget book include the following new positions:

- Promotion within the Sheriff's Office to a newly created position of Captain
- An additional Sheriff Deputy, to be hired at mid-year but to remain a permanent position
- A new Evidence Technician for the Sheriff's Office
- Hiring a 10 hour per week custodian, to free up .25 time of a current employee to assume a Lead Custodian role
- Adding one Solid Waste Technician (no impact to Levy)
- Establishing a Cultural Coordinator and ICWA (Indian Child Welfare Act) Specialist
- Promoting from within (no new staff) to a newly created position of Lead Intake and Investigations in Social Services

Reduction in Staffing - a Result of the City of Bemidji ending the Legal Services Agreement o One Full Time Attorney o One Full Time Legal Assistant

These changes result in adding only 1.75 Full Time Equivalents to the levy covered county workforce.

It was noted that the new Cultural Coordinator position should be closely monitored for its effectiveness in positively affecting specific issues and ICWA funding.

It was noted that this was a very difficult budget. With limited revenue and growing needs, it is imperative that State and Federal level assistance be aggressively pursued. Administrator Mack pointed out the fact that the budget presented is NOT a balanced budget, and that there is not a reasonable way to levy enough to cover the huge costs of out-of-home placements.

The final levy and budget are intended to be adopted at the first board meeting in December.

A motion was made by Commissioner Olson, and seconded by Commissioner Winger, to support the proposed budget, levy and staffing requests presented by the Budget Committee; with a proposed budget of \$23,477,089, representing a 5.83% increase in levy. Carried 4:1 vote. Commissioner Lucachick voting No.

<u>Veterans Home Local Funding Update</u> This item was cancelled at this time.

Workforce Impact Program Update

Economic Assistance Division Director, Anne Lindseth, provided program specific information on participant and program information and activities.

Statistics on the MFIP population referred to Workforce Impact from 1/1/17 - Current:

• Workforce Impact served 717 MFIP cases in this 20 month time frame. Of the 717 cases 521 exited off the program for a variety of reasons.

Closure Reasons:

- 17 cases closed due to meeting the 60 month time limit
- 136 closed due to failure to file appropriate documents with our Income Maintenance Unit or relocated to Red Lake and were served under the Red Lake TANF program
- 60 cases moved out of Beltrami County

- 11 cases moved out of Minnesota
- 59 cases closed due to the children or eligible family member leaving the home
- 37 cases closed due to sanction
- 5 cases closed when they became eligible for Supplemental Security Income
- 34 cases request that their case close
- 162 cases closed due to employment

Although 162 cases closed due to employment, 211 were working at time of closure. This means their case would have remained eligible for public assistance with their current wage if the other circumstance did not require case closure.

In September Workforce Impact closed 57 cases. Many of the cases closed were due to an expansion of programming by Red Lake Oshkiimaajitahdah. Oshkiimaajitahdah is serving employment service cases for Red Lake enrolled applicants residing off of Red Lake Nation within Beltrami County. The staff person who was servicing those cases through our partnership with Oshkiimaajitahdah is an Oshkiimaajitahdah employee and has relocated to the Bemidji Oshkiimaajitahdah office to continue serving those clients.

Each month Workforce Impact closes people off the program and enrolls newly referred cases. Once the case closes Workforce Impact no longer keeps contact information or requires contact with that applicant. Any applicant can close off of the program and re-apply and continue to receive benefits for up to 60 months in their lifetime. There are extension categories to that 60 month limit if applicants meet specified eligibility criteria.

The Department of Employment and Economic Development does provide information on MFIP applicants and the percentage that are working three years later. This is a performance measure for employment and training programs across the state titled the Self Support Index. This is pulled by DEED, using Department of Labor information.

Biggest stumbling block of the program - drug related issues.

Red Lake Watershed District Update

Red Lake Watershed District Board Member, Brian Dwight, introduced member Arlene Novak, who provided the RLWD Annual Report briefing.

Brian Dwight mentioned the current top four project/work items of the Red Lake Watershed District:

- 1. Red Lake Nation is asking for a seat on the Board. This will require special legislation, and the Board and Red Lake are working on making it a possibility.
- 2. The Board is also working on updating the Thief River Watershed Plan
- 3. The outlet structure on Blackduck Lake is a dam modification at the headwaters of the Blackduck River.
- 4. Weed Management Project on Bartlet Lake in Koochiching County is another significant project for this watershed.

WHEREAS, Beltrami County tax-forfeited lands harbor many noxious weeds currently on the Noxious Weed Control list, especially Spotted Knapweed, Common Tansy, and Canada Thistle;

WHEREAS, the Beltrami County Natural Resource Management (NRM) Department has the opportunity to apply for a 2019 Minnesota Department of Agriculture Noxious Weed and Invasive Plant Program Grant for \$26,000 to help control noxious weeds; WHEREAS, the in-kind amount would be provided by existing NRM Department employee personnel costs and travel costs to the project sites;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners authorizes the Land Commissioner to apply to the Noxious Weed and Invasive Plant Program Grant to help fund biological control measures and herbicide application on plants on the State Prohibited Noxious Weed List. The SWCD Board and District Manager identified two staff position needs in 2016 and asked the County to create the job classifications at that time. In June 2016, the Clean Water Specialist Position was created and filled. The SWCD has now voted to create and fill the second position after reviewing the capabilities and needs of the SWCD. Current funding is guaranteed for this position for three years and anticipated that funding will continue long term and totally paid by grant dollars. Currently at approximately \$111,400/year.

A motion was made by Commissioner Sumner, and seconded by Commissioner Lucachick, to fill one Full Time SWCD Conservation Technician Position funded entirely by SWCD Grant Dollars. Unanimously carried.

Set Public Hearing Date Update Ordinance No. 29

A motion was made by Commissioner Winger and seconded by Commissioner Olson, to set a Public Hearing Date of December 11, 2018 to Amend Section V.A. of Ordinance No. 29 Tobacco Licensing and Sales Regulation; to increase the minimum age from 18 to 21 for the sale of tobacco, tobacco products or electronic delivery devices. Unanimously carried.

Public Hearing - Petitions for Ditch 35

There are two petitions, Judicial Ditch #35 Petition for Removal and Judicial Ditch #35 Petition for Partial Abandonment.

Commissioner Anderson provided the following Ditch #35 summary:

- The Ditch Authority may be referred to as the County Board
- July 24, 2018 Public Hearing on a Petition for Removal of 23 parcels. Public Hearing continued to October 16.

- October 4 Administrator & Hwy Engineer met with property owners Schoenfelder and Kelm to review petition language that would satisfy ditch law and be supported by Ditch Authority and property owners in the removal area.
- October 16 Continuation of Public Hearing. Original Petition for Removal was denied by Ditch Authority.
- October 17 Petition for Partial Abandonment & Petition for Removal delivered to County Auditor.
- November 7 Public Hearing Notices mailed to benefitted property owners on Ditch 35.
- November 20 Public Hearing

Highway Engineer, Bruce Hasbargen reviewed the two petitions and provided the following recommendations:

- For partial abandonment petition, the Drainage Authority must make findings that the ditch:
 - o Does not serve a substantial useful purpose as part of the drainage system to any property remaining in the system and;
 - o Is not of a substantial public benefit and utility.
- For removal of property petition, the petitioners are to demonstrate that they have meet all three of the following requirements:
 - o The waters from the petitioners' properties have been diverted from the drainage system, or that the property cannot significantly or regularly use the drainage system;
 - o That the property is not benefitted by the drainage system; and
 - That removing the property from the drainage system will not prejudice the property owners and property remaining in the system.

Engineer's recommendation is that due to the lack of ditch maintenance and with the construction of two ditch plugs, this ditch segment would not serve a substantial useful purpose or public benefit. The waters from the petitioners' property would be substantially held within the wetland area, the properties would not benefit from the ditch system, and removing the properties would not prejudice the property owners remaining in the ditch system. Therefore, the recommendation is to approve both petitions.

Commissioner Anderson Opened the Public Hearing

• Alan Snider, resident on Birchmont Ct NE, at the southern end of the ditch system on Lake Bemidji; claims that the County

claimed they had no authority over the outlet into Lake Bemidji when the area was having water issues several years ago.

- Deb Bauer, resident on Diesel Dr. (north end of ditch system in petition area) stated concerns over what plugging the ditch may do. Without a hydrological study, there is no way of knowing what impact plugging the ditch will have into the future and how property will be affected. What impact will the activities of property owners down the system have on the properties that were removed and how will they be protected?
- Jerry Schoenfelder, resident on Irvine Ave and in the petition area stated that there is a 32 ft. difference in elevation from Meadow Lake to Irvine Avenue developments.

A motion was made by Commissioner Olson and seconded by Commissioner Lucachick to close the public hearing.

Question was raised as to the cost incurred by the ditch to date and the cost of plugging the ditch. Administrator Mack reported \$8,373 in total costs to date, and an estimated \$6,500 to construct two plugs.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lucachick and seconded by Commissioner Winger, as the Ditch Authority, to approve both petitions as follows:

For the partial abandonment of Judicial Ditch #35; no further repair petition for the abandoned portion of the drainage system may be accepted and the drainage authority's responsibility to maintain the abandoned portion of drainage system is terminated by this order. This order shall not release any property from costs on account of the drainage system before the date of this order. This order shall not release any property from any assessment or a drainage lien filed on or after the date of this order for costs incurred on account of the drainage system before the date of the order, and all properties shall be liable for all costs to construct the ditch plugs referenced in the proceedings.

For the petition to remove properties from JD 35: the properties shall be removed from the benefits roll of JD 35. This order shall not release any property from costs on account of the drainage system before the date of this order. This order shall not release any property from any assessment or a drainage lien filed on or after the date of this order for costs incurred on account of the drainage system before the date of the order, and all properties shall be liable for all costs to construct the ditch plugs referenced in the proceedings. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Commissioner Olson and seconded by Commissioner Winger to authorize the Highway Engineer to proceed with process to install two ditch plugs on Judicial Ditch #35 at the designation locations to satisfy the petition for removal of properties. Commissioner Lucachick offered an amendment of "not to exceed \$10,000". Amendment was accepted. Unanimously carried.

<u>Public Hearing - Shoreland Management Ordinance No. 6 Update</u> Environmental Services Director, Brent Rud, provided an update on the status of the Ordinance. Open House and information sessions have been held and some feedback has been received.

Commissioner Anderson Opened the Public Hearing

- John Peterson, owner of Clearview Resort on Birchmont Dr. address concerns about the 30 day restriction on rental use and questions regarding the 50 ft. buffer requirement if his property is in no way affecting or polluting the lake.
- Ben Wangberg, resident on Waters Edge Dr. has a long list of items and details within the Ordinance that he is questioning or opposing. To name a few:
 - o The over-riding question being: What is the reason for all the changes?
 - o Many of the new requirements would render the minimum lot size inadequate.
 - o Way too many permits required to do things.
 - o Too much regulation.
 - o Mr. Wangberg would be happy to review the ordinance in greater detail with staff.
- Leroy Anderson, Solway resident expressed his concern over the whole expansion of government rules and regulation. The DNR already has setback regulations for farmers.
- Bob Wallner, Pennington resident stated that he felt the new ordinance was a 'solution looking for a problem'. What exactly is the problem? The lack of prosecutions in a court of law is a strong indication that there is currently no problem.
- Matt Murray, resident on Jack Pine Road had a long list of concerns, including:
 - Legal Notice of public meetings in the newspaper is not a sufficient means of letting people know what is going on. Affected land owners have not felt that they have had a chance to weigh in on the issues.
 - o No rational basis has been provided to support substantial changes.
 - o Why is this Ordinance more restrictive than the 2017 Model Shoreland Ordinance provided by the DNR?
 - o Is there any justification or proof of degradation of shoreland and lake quality to warrant more regulation?

- o The current 25% impervious surface requirement seems more than adequate, what is the rational basis to change it to a 15% impervious surface requirement?
- Dale Wilson, resident at Dove Court has property along Highway 2 on the opposite side of the highway from a lake. According to the requirements of the proposed Ordinance changes, over 35 acres of his property would be affected.
- Todd Haugen, resident on Lake Movil stated that under the requirements of the new ordinance, his lot would be non-compliant.
 - o Parcels should be addressed on a case by case basis.
 - o What is the justification for all the changes? Urged the Board to re-evaluate the proposed changes.
- Emily Rivera, 17th Street resident, believes that there is need for some regulation and guidelines. It is the responsibility of all lake shore property owners to be good stewards for the good of everyone; even more so here in Beltrami County at the head of the Mississippi River. A degree of change is warranted as the current process seems very arbitrary. She spoke in favor of buffer vegetation changes.
- Jeff Allison, from Turtle River is in support of the shoreland buffer. Asked if any professional opinion or analysis on buffering techniques and best practices has been obtained? Land owners should take the responsibility to properly maintain their property; it should not be labeled as mandatory.
- Howie Zetah, resident on Lake Movil indicated his agreement with most of what has been stated. The County should take the time to do a good and thorough job of implementing the right requirements in the shoreland ordinance.
- Craig Gaasvig, resident on Gull Lake Loop Rd requested that the Board consider having another public hearing after input and modifications are made.
- Administrator, Kay Mack stated that she prides the County Board and Staff on their abilities and integrity in being all inclusive and fair in an effort to do the best job for all citizens of the County. Ms. Mack requested feedback from citizens on ways to better inform and engage the public on matters that affect them.
- Bob Naylor suggested using tax statements as a method to disseminate information to all county residents.
- Commissioner Anderson reassured everyone, that the Board is in no rush to make a decision on this Ordinance. It is quite apparent that there is still a lot of work to be done before any changes are made.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lucachick and seconded by Commissioner Winger to close the public hearing.

Administrator's Report

- The Proposed 2019 fee schedule was distributed to members of the Board for review and comment and will be submitted for approval at the December 11 Board Meeting.
- Development Fund books were distributed for review. Included was a worksheet for Commissioners to indicate their proposed grant awards for review during the December 11 Work Session. Maximum available funds are \$96,500.
- The City of Bemidji is requesting use of the County Board room to conduct city council meeting while their location is under construction. Members of the Board were agreeable.
- Administrator's Performance Appraisal is due before the end of the year. Members of the Board should designate a closed session time on December 11 or 18 before the Regular Meeting to conduct the appraisal.

REGULAR AGENDA

Public Hearing: Consideration of Amendment to Ordinance #29 Tobacco Licensing and Sales

Commissioner Richard Anderson opened the public hearing:

• Medical Consultant to Beltrami County, Dr. TJ Luma provided statistics, and overview to the value and importance to the County for supporting the recommendation to raise the

minimum legal age to purchase tobacco and tobacco products from 18 to 21 years old.

Public Health Division Director, Cynthia Borgan provided a PowerPoint overview of the concerns around the increasing rate of youth using tobacco and how the Tobacco 21 (T21) policy can help.

The 2017 Youth Tobacco Survey shows for the first time since 2000, overall youth tobacco use has increased in Minnesota.

The goal of the Community Health Board is ultimately, to reduce the number of teens and young adults that start smoking, which will reduce the number of tobacco related diseases and deaths; leading to a healthier community.

- ISD #31 Superintendent, Tim Lutz provided input on behalf of all school principals that it would be easier to get tobacco/tobacco products out of the schools if the legal age to purchase was increased. Even the military is in support of raising the age to 21 for the purchase of tobacco products. It is our responsibility to make every attempt to help our youth stay safe and healthy.
- Dr. Ralph Morris spoke in support of raising the age to 21. Just recently tobacco companies have been sanctioned for selling flavored tobaccos targeted at youth. Tobacco is the leading cause of preventable disease in our country. Mr. Morris compared it to when the legal drinking age was raised to 21 and the positive statistics that followed.
- Jack Twelvetrees, a 9th grade student of ISD #31 is in support of efforts to stop tobacco use in the schools. He confirmed that as a 9th grader, he has frequent contact with 18 year olds but very little with 21 year olds.
- Warren Larson, Sanford Public Relations, and member of the American Cancer Society and Cancer Alliance pointed out how Beltrami County has been a leader in implementing a smoke free environment and developing ground breaking County Policy in setting their standards. Mr. Larson referenced another section of Ordinance #29 that talks about enforcement and penalty for possession of tobacco products. He suggested that this language also be edited. Penalizing youth for the Possession, Use or Purchase (PUP) of tobacco products is not an effective way to achieve the goal of reducing the number of teens using tobacco products.
- Pete Korhonen, a Nurse, who confirms that he has witnessed the disease and death due to tobacco use a daily basis, spoke to the Board as the father of six children who wants

the best for his kids. He stressed the importance of working together as a community to protect our children and do everything in our power to keep them healthy and safe. Bemidji was voted the greatest city in Minnesota for a reason - we have the people and the vision to be leaders in supporting the T21 initiative.

• Suzie Human, a local area Physician, agreed that it is very important to also get the PUP language out of the Ordinance. Penalty should be on the entity selling to the under age individual. Not starting and not becoming addicted to nicotine is life changing.

Commissioner Anderson reminded everyone that this public hearing is the first of two. A second hearing will be scheduled at a later date. Commissioner Anderson closed the public hearing.

County Attorney, David Hanson, pointed out that the Ordinance is stating the crime for possession is a Misdemeanor and the State Law is at a Petty Misdemeanor level.

Commissioner Olson suggested removal of the language in the Ordinance in Section 7a about illegal possession and rely on existing State Law when necessary for enforcement.

Commissioner Sumner is completely against raising the age from 18 to 21 and the enforcement against youth in possession of tobacco products. He stated it as an example of Government over-reach.

Commissioner Winger stressed that as the County Board of Health, the Board is obligated to do what is best for the health of all of its citizens, and the statistics strongly indicate that raising the age to purchase tobacco products from 18 to 21 is definitely a step in the right direction.

It is apparent that there is more work to be done with Ordinance #29 before it will be ready for another public hearing.

Set Date for Second Public Hearing: Consideration of Amendment to Ordinance #29 Tobacco Licensing and Sales

The County is required by State Statue to send notice by mail at least 30 days prior to the a Public Hearing, to each person required to hold a license to sell tobacco and related products, letting them know about the proposed change to the Ordinance. The notice shall include the date, time and location of the meeting, along with a summary of the subject matter.

A second public hearing date will be set at a future meeting.

The Beltrami County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on December 18, 2018, at the County Board Room, County Administration Building, Bemidji, Minnesota.

CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Vice Chair Jim Lucachick called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. Commissioners, Keith Winger, Tim Sumner and Reed Olson were present. Richard Anderson was excused.

GENERAL COMMENTS - BOARD CHAIR

Commissioner Lucachick made opening remarks welcoming and inviting citizens to attend Board meetings.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Beltrami, that 30 percent of the receipts for the year of 2018 remaining after administration, special assessments, and bond levy are paid, be set aside to be used for the purpose as specified in MS 282.08, Subdivision 4; of this, \$200,000 is to be transferred to the County Development fund and the remainder of the 30 percent is to be used exclusively for timber development programs on tax forfeited lands; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that 20 percent of the receipts remaining to be used for the acquisition and maintenance of county parks or recreational areas, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any balance remaining must be apportioned as follows: county, 40 percent; town or city, 20 percent; and school district, 40 percent, provided,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that 70% of all revenues generated through timber harvest from Three Island County Park shall be used for the maintenance of County Parks and Recreation areas within Beltrami County, 20% shall be used for reforestation of County Parks and Recreation areas and the remaining 10% of the revenues will be apportioned to the townships with direct interest for maintenance of township roads.
