GENERAL COMMENTS - OUTGOING BOARD CHAIR

Chairman Tim Sumner called the meeting back to order 5:57 p.m. Mr. Sumner welcomed members of the Board and expressed his hopes of working together as a team in efforts to make Beltrami County a better place for everyone.

ELECTION OF BOARD OFFICERS

A motion was made by Commissioner Gaasvig, and seconded by Commissioner Gould, to appoint Richard Anderson as Board Chair and Commissioner John Carlson as Board Vice Chair, for 2023. Unanimously carried.

The Board, by adoption of its Consent Agenda, approved the Minutes of the Board of Commissioners Work Meeting held December 20, 2022, and the Minutes of the Board of Commissioners Regular Meeting held December 20, 2022, as submitted.

The Board, by adoption of its Consent Agenda, received and approved the warrant payment listing submitted by the Auditor/Treasurer's Office.

Approved Payment of Auditor/Treasurer Bills

The Board, by adoption of its Consent Agenda, approved payment of Auditor/Treasurer bills, as submitted.

Approved Appointment to Watershed District Board

The Board, by adoption of its Consent Agenda, approved the reappointment of Brian Dwight to the Red Lake Watershed Board for a three year term beginning 1-1-2023.

Approved Resolution and Delegated Contract Process Agreement with MnDOT

The Board, by adoption of its Consent Agenda, approved the Resolution and Delegated Contract Process Agreement for local public agencies to allow for MnDOT to act as County's agent in accepting federal aid funds:

BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Minnesota Stat. Sec. 161.36, the Commissioner of Transportation be appointed as Agent of Beltrami County to accept as its agent, federal aid funds which may be made available for eligible transportation related projects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Chairman and Administrator are hereby authorized and directed for and on behalf of Beltrami County to execute and enter into an agreement with the Commissioner of Transportation prescribing the terms and conditions of said federal aid participation as set forth and contained in "Minnesota Department of Transportation Agency Agreement No. 1052057", a copy of which said agreement was before the County Board and which is made a part hereof by reference.

Approved Resolution to Offer for Sale a Non-Conforming Tax-Forfeited Parcel to Adjacent Land Owners The Board, by adoption of its Consent Agenda, approved the Resolution to offer for sale, a non-conforming tax-forfeited parcel to the adjacent land owners:

WHEREAS, Chapter 282.01 to 282.12, Minnesota Statutes 1941, as amended, provides for the classification and sale of such lands forfeited to the State for delinquent taxes, and whereas such classification has been made by the County Board and the classification and sale have or by the governing body of the municipality in which they lie in so far as the lands located within said town or municipality are concerned; and,

WHEREAS, The County Board has made appraisal of such lands as provided by law, and a list of such lands has been filed with the County Auditor for the purpose of offering such lands for sale at not less than their appraised value; and,

WHEREAS, Said 0.08-acre non-conforming parcel, located in the City of Turtle River in Section 32-T148N-R32W, TURTLE RIVER Lot-005 Block-002, was approved for sale by the Beltrami County Land Review Committee and the City of Turtle River; and,

WHEREAS, The County Board is by law designated with authority to provide for the sale of such lands on terms and whereas the County Board has considered the advisability of selling on terms and has considered the accessibility of such lands, their proximity to existing public improvements and the effect of their sale and occupancy on the public burdens; and,

WHEREAS, This parcel is non-conforming, being too small to build upon, and would be best to be attached to the parcel of the highest bidding adjoining land owner;

WHEREAS, The sale of this parcel would resolve a garage encroachment situation on tax-forfeited land;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That such parcel shall be sold on the following terms, to-wit: That all sales shall be paid in full in cash within three business days from date of sealed bid auction. Special assessments and the appraised price of any standing timber or timber products must be paid for in cash at the time of the sale; and in the case any parcel of land bearing standing timber or timber products is sold at public auction for more than the appraised value, the amount bid in excess of the appraised value shall be allocated between the land and the timber in proportion to the respective original appraised values thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all purchasers of land shall pay a 3 percent surcharge of the total sale price to be paid into the state assurance account as provided by Chapter 383, Laws of 1969, a state deed fee of \$25.00, a deed filing fee of \$46.00, and a state deed tax equal to the greater of \$1.65 or 0.33% of the basic sale price.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That where any lands herein offered for sale do not adjoin or are not located on a suitable legally established and maintained public highway or road, the township wherein said lands may be located, nor any other municipality shall not for a period of five years be obligated to the establishment, construction or additional maintenance of any public roads or the expenditure of any public funds for the benefit of the owner or occupant of any lands herein purchased by reason of the ownership or occupancy of any of this land; provided further, that nothing herein shall be construed to create any obligation, directly or indirectly, on the part of any municipality for the expenditure of any money for the benefit of said parcel after the expiration of said five-year period. Responsibility for determining boundary lines of parcels purchased rests with the purchaser.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the right is reserved in the interest of the public to withdraw from sale, any parcel, at any time prior to its sale.

BE I T FURTHER RESOLVED, That all lands sold hereunder are sold subject to any ordinances adopted by the County Board, and all lands are sold subject to railroad and highway easements, power and pipeline easements and subject to all flowage rights, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a notice of sale of such land will be given to the three adjoining landowners, as provided by law, that the County Auditor of Beltrami County offer such parcel of land for sale and that such sale be to the highest bid, but not for less than appraised value and that such bids will be opened at 1:00 p.m. on February 10, 2023.

WHEREAS, said parcels on the proposed list have been examined and wetland/marginal land determinations have been made with regards to same by all appropriate parties in accordance with the requirements of 1991 Laws of Minnesota, Chapter 354, Article 10, Section 9d;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners hereby certify that all parcels of land on the

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attached list have been reviewed and comply with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 85.012; 92.461; 282.01, Subd. 8; and 282.018; and other statutes that require withholding of tax-forfeited lands from sale;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners hereby request a review from the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources for the sale of said lands and, after review, request Special Legislation from the Minnesota State Legislature for parcels that may be offered via private sale.

Legislative Lobbyist Discussion

The Minnesota Legislative Session starts January 3, 2023. The County has identified more than a dozen legislative priorities in its 2023 Legislative Platform. Several of these legislative priorities are critical to the County and will likely require additional spearheading at the State Capitol.

Administrator Barry discussed the cost of hiring a lobbyist (probably between \$15,000-\$40,000) depending on the scope of work. Timing is very critical, as the legislative session has already started.

Commissioners Carlson and Gould were asked for their professional opinions. Commissioner Carlson, as a former State Senator, stated that lobbyists were very important and useful in educating them on issues and providing accurate and relevant information on both sides of an issue/request. With a project as complex as our jail, he feels that a lobbyist would be very beneficial.

Commissioner Gould, with his experience as a legislative assistant and former lobbyist, agreed with Commissioner Carlson. Staff should reach out to AMC and other contacts as soon as possible to develop a list of potential lobbyists.

Administrator Barry suggested a small committee develop an RFP and get it out as soon as possible to potential lobbyists.

Funding would be available through the Strategic Aligned Management Fund, which is the same fund currently being used for work on the jail project to date.

Members of the Board requested Administrator Barry to attempt to have a contract for consulting services to present at the January 17 board meeting if at all possible. Top priority issues for lobbyist services would be 1)Jail bonding bill, 2)LOST approval, and 3)A funding appropriation for the Jail.

Special assessments and the appraised price of any standing timber or timber products must be paid for in cash at the time of the sale; and in the case any parcel of land bearing standing timber or timber products is sold at auction for more than the appraised value, the amount bid in excess of the appraised value shall be allocated between the land and the timber in proportion to the respective original appraised values thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That all purchasers of land shall pay 3 percent surcharge of the total sale price to be paid to Minnesota Management and Budget, a state deed fee of \$25.00, a deed filing fee of \$46.00, and a state deed tax equal to the greater of \$1.65 or 0.33% of the basic sale price.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That where any lands herein offered for sale do not adjoin or are not located on a suitable legally established and maintained public highway or road, the township wherein said lands may be located, nor any other municipality shall not for a period of five years be obligated to the establishment, construction or additional maintenance of any public roads or the expenditure of any public funds for the benefit of the owner or occupant of any lands herein purchased by reason of the ownership or occupancy of any of this land; provided further, that nothing herein shall be construed to create any obligation, directly or indirectly, on the part of any municipality for the expenditure of any money for the benefit of said parcel after the expiration of said five-year period. Responsibility for determining boundary lines of parcels purchased rests with the purchaser.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the right is reserved in the interest

of the public to withdraw from sale, any parcel, at any time prior to its sale.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That all lands sold hereunder are sold subject to any ordinances adopted by the County Board, and all lands are sold subject to railroad and highway easements, power and pipeline easements, and subject to all flowage rights, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That in no case shall lands be disposed of without there being reserved to the county all iron ore and other valuable minerals in and upon the lands, with right to explore for, mine and remove the iron ore and other valuable minerals, nor shall the minerals and mineral rights be disposed of, either before or after disposition of the surface rights, otherwise than by mining lease, in similar general form to that provided by section 93.20 for mining leases affecting state lands. The lease shall be for a term not exceeding 50 years, and be issued on a royalty basis, the royalty to be not less than 25 cents per ton of 2,240 pounds, and fix a minimum amount of royalty payable during each year, whether mineral is removed or not. Prospecting options for mining leases may be granted for periods not exceeding one year. The options shall require, among other things, periodical showings to the county board of the results of exploration work done.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a notice of sale of such lands to be given by publication in the official newspaper of the County, as provided by law, that the County Auditor of Beltrami County offer such parcels of land for sale in the order in which they appear in said notice of sale and that such sales to be to the highest bidder, but not for less than the appraised value and that such sale of two parcels shall be held at a public oral auction on December 15, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. at the Beltrami County Board Room, County Administration Building, 701 Minnesota Ave. NW, Bemidji, MN 56601 and the sale of three parcels will be via private sealed bid auction on December 15, 2022 at 1:00 pm at the Beltrami County Natural Resource Management Department, 701 Minnesota Ave. NW, Suite 234, Bemidji, MN 56601.

WHEREAS, creating a regional solid waste management "Hub and Spoke" system would provide new or expand upon existing access to reuse, recycling, composting and responsible disposal of materials within our nine counties; and,

WHEREAS, creating a regional "Hub and Spoke" system would reduce Green House Gas (GHG) emissions by facilitating the hauling of large loads in lieu of hauling many small loads to the Hub and promote beneficial reuse at each Spoke; and,

WHEREAS, if received the SWIFR grant would serve and benefit many disadvantaged communities within our nine-county region.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners supports the EPA SWIFR grant funding request and if received, Beltrami County is committed to implementation of the nine-county infrastructure project to support the "Hub and Spoke" system.

Resolution Endorsing a Cooperative Grant Application for EPA SWIFR Funding for Recycling Infrastructure:

WHEREAS, US EPA has provided for Grant funding through the Solid Waste Infrastructure for Recycling (SWIFR) for Political Subdivisions to construct, modify or expand recycling infrastructure for CY 2023, Polk County is applying for a SWIFR grant on behalf of six (6) counties in northwestern Minnesota including: Beltrami, Clearwater, Hubbard, Mahnomen, Norman, and Polk; and

WHEREAS, the six-county group has an extensive history of working together on cooperative regional projects including Waste-to-Energy, Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) Landfill, Waste and Recyclable Processing at the Material Recovery Facility (MRF), Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) and Source Separated Organics Material (SSOM) Composting; and,

WHEREAS, the six-county group proposes to modify its MRF to increase the amount of, and types of recyclable material removed from the MSW material stream and recyclable material stream; and,

WHEREAS, incorporation of robotic sorters at the MRF to clean the recyclable materials to meet marketplace requirements is a main component of the grant request related to this project. The robots would fill manual sorting stations which have remained vacant for over 3 years due to lack of laborers; and,

WHEREAS, modification to the SSOM compost pad and incorporation of Aerated Static Pile (ASP) compost technologies are main components of the grant request related to this project and changes to the

Pad and integration of ASP technology would reduce composting time and increase holding and processing capacity of the SSOM Compost Facility; and,

WHEREAS, recovery of more recyclable material from the MSW and Recycle materials streams processed by the MRF results in avoidance of disposal and the GHG and CO emissions associated with Climate Change and improving the Compost Pad to be usable during and after severe weather events, which are both more frequent and severe due to Climate Change, and incorporating ASP technologies to speed up the composting process will allow more materials to be diverted from disposal to composted; and,

WHEREAS, these results and impacts of these changes made with SWIFR Grant Funds would benefit the many underserved communities within and surrounding the six-county group service area.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners supports that if SWIFR grant funding is received, Beltrami County is committed to implementation of the six-county group infrastructure project to modify the MRF and SSOM Compost Facility.

Probation Resolution

At the AMC Board of Directors meeting on December 4, 2022 the Board approved legislative priorities for the 2023 legislative session. As in 2022, a change in the funding formula for Community Supervision and increased appropriations is one of the top priorities for the AMC Board this year. The AMC Board also recently passed a motion to encourage all 87 county boards to adopt a resolution in support of the formula change and a significant increase in appropriations from the legislature: Beltrami County Board of Commissioners Meeting Minutes

Endorsing the efforts of the Community Supervision Work Group and urging the legislature to pass a new funding formula and significant appropriation during the 2023 legislative session.

WHEREAS, community supervision is a fundamental part of the criminal justice system in Minnesota and funding sufficient to ensure effective services is vital to public safety in all communities across the state; and

WHEREAS, community supervision includes services such as probation, supervised release, and intensive supervised release; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota's counties provide essential community supervision services both as mandated by M.S. Chapter 244.19 and also as delegated by the Department of Corrections under M.S. Chapter 401; and

WHEREAS, when the Legislature decided that community supervision was best delivered through a state-county partnership, it stated a clear intent that the state would provide significant funding to the counties for the operation of local programs; and

WHEREAS, over the past 20 years, Minnesota has become the state with the lowest level of corrections funding in the nation because the Legislature has not upheld its promise to provide adequate state resources to support community supervision; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature's failure to adequately fund community supervision has increased local property taxes on residents and businesses; and,

WHEREAS, a revised community supervision funding formula is necessary to ensure that all communities in Minnesota have enough state funding to provide a consistent standard for effective, evidence-based community supervision services, regardless of local capacity to pay; and

WHEREAS, the Association of Minnesota Counties (AMC) assembled the Community Supervision Work Group including county leaders and experts in community supervision from all three supervision delivery systems to study the needs of community supervision departments statewide and develop a single funding formula that is transparent, needs based, and equitable among county and state supervision providers; and,

WHEREAS, the Community Supervision Workgroup has taken up its charge to convene stakeholders across the three probation delivery

systems to oversee a study to create a unified recommendation for an equitable and adequate funding formula and appropriation; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Association of Minnesota Counties that represents the diverse interests of Minnesota's 87 counties, voted to support a new funding formula that provides counties with the resources needed to keep communities safe; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners endorses the efforts of the AMC Community Supervision Work Group and urges the Legislature to pass a new funding formula and significant appropriation during the 2023 legislative session. Out of State Travel Request

A motion was made by Commissioner Sumner, and seconded by Commissioner Carlson, to approve the Resolution endorsing the efforts of the Community Supervision Work Group and urging the legislature to pass a new funding formula and significant appropriation during the 2023 legislative session. Unanimously carried.

Out of State Travel Request

Minnesota's Local Public Health Association awarded stipends to select agencies across the state for attendance to the 2023 Preparedness Summit. The National Conference takes place in Atlanta, GA, April 24-27, 2023. Topics this year will include infectious disease, pandemic response, and also Opioid Crisis Management. Travel and conference expenses are covered, with no additional cost to the County. Public Health Director, Megan Heuer, is requesting permission to send Public Health Program Manager, Mercideze White to this Summit.

A motion was made by Commissioner Carlson, and seconded by Commissioner Gould, to approve out of state travel for Mercideze White to attend the April 24-27. 2023 Preparedness Summit in Atlanta GA, as submitted and report back to the Board. Unanimously carried.

Appointment to Jail Steering Committee

The Beltrami County Jail Steering Committee has representation from County Government, City of Bemidji Government, Beltrami County Citizens, Department of Corrections, Construction Management and Tribal Governments (Red Lake and Leech Lake reservations) Chairman Seki of the Red Lake Nation is unable to attend many of the meetings and has asked to delegate these meetings to Jerry Loud to speak and have say on his behalf. The Jail Steering Committee voted in favor of this so the Red Lake Nations voice could be heard during this crucial time of steering this project.

A motion was made by Commissioner Sumner, and seconded by Commissioner Gould, to approve the appointment of Jerry Loud to the Jail Steering Committee on behalf of Red Lake Chairman Seki. Unanimously carried.

Liquor License for Bemidji High School Fishing Club

A motion was made by Commissioner Gaasvig, and seconded by Commissioner Gould, to approve the Liquor License Application from the Bemidji High School Fishing Club at the Birchmont Winter Bash event, as submitted. Unanimously carried.

Budget Amendment for the County Jail

A motion was made by Commissioner Carlson, and seconded by Commissioner Gaasvig, to approve the budget amendment to add 2 FTEs to the Jail and add \$390,000 to the FY23 Budget to cover the 2 new FTEs and to cover the additional out-of-county housing costs using ARPA dollars. Unanimously carried.

County Administrator Performance Evaluation

Commissioner Gaasvig provided a summary of the County Administrator's performance evaluation and stated that the majority of the Commissioners rated the Administrator as exceeding expectations.

A motion was made by Commissioner Gaasvig and seconded by Commissioner Sumner to place the County Administrator at pay grade 24 step 6 and that the County pay for all of the Administrator's premiums for family medical and to amend the Administrator's employment contract to include five hours of availability pay and update the termination provision to align it with Minnesota Statute 465.722 to allow for a 6-month severance. Unanimously carried.

WHEREAS, CSAH 20 is located along the north shore of Lake Bemidji and is one of the main east/west routes in Beltrami County; and

WHEREAS, there are many traffic generators on CSAH 20 such as Lake Bemidji State Park, MnDNR Regional Headquarters, Concordia Language Villages, Bemidji Town and Country Golf Club, Chippewa National Forest, multiple resorts, residential developments, seasonal recreational properties, and acres of public lands and lakes; and

WHEREAS, many bicyclists and pedestrians utilize CSAH 20 traveling from Lake Bemidji State Park to the City of Bemidji and around Lake Bemidji; and

WHEREAS, the proposed road improvements will provide a safer route, improving the narrow road and poor road surface; and

WHEREAS, the proposed road improvements will also include a multiuse trail which will provide a safer location for pedestrians and bicyclists than the existing narrow road; and

WHEREAS, Lake Bemidji is an historic and spiritual water body which serves as an important cultural and recreational resource to the region; and

WHEREAS, the combination of a high-water table and many aging residential and commercial septic systems on the Northwest and North end of Lake Bemidji pose a potential health risk and threaten the water quality of Lake Bemidji; and

WHEREAS, Ruttger's Resort, the MN DNR Regional Headquarters and Lake Bemidji State Park, which are located on the Northwest and North end of Lake Bemidji, all need to replace their aging septic systems; and

WHEREAS, Ruttger's Resort, the MN DNR Regional Headquarters and Lake Bemidji State Park have expressed their support for a proposed water and sanitary sewer project extending along Birchmont Beach Road to serve their facilities; and

WHEREAS, the proposed water and sanitary sewer project will help maintain water quality of a shared natural resource of great importance to our region and improve resident's land use ability; and

WHEREAS, the extension of water and sanitary sewer services in this area has been a regional planning goal for over 50 years; and

WHEREAS, Combining the proposed water and sanitary sewer project with the planned Beltrami County CSAH20 roadway improvement project will greatly reduce costs and be less disruptive to businesses, residents and tourists; Now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners do hereby support the CSAH 20 Road Improvement Project and the Water and Sanitary Sewer Project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners supports and encourages allocation of any State or Federal funding that may help fund the road improvement project and the important water quality project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if Beltrami County is awarded a grant by the U.S. Department of Transportation, the County agrees to accept the grant award, and may enter into an agreement with the U.S DOT for the above referenced project. 1. Said position requires a license by the Minnesota peace officer standards and training board under sections 626.84 to 626.863 and this employee is so licensed;

2. Said position's primary (over 50%) duty is to enforce the general criminal laws of the state;

3. Said position charges this employee with the prevention and detection of crime;

4. Said position gives this employee the full power of arrest, and

5. Said position is assigned to a designated police or sheriff's department.

Sheriff's Captain Wage

Commander Joe Kleszyk has been working as the PBTF commander for the past 4 years. His current base wage is \$42.96 and his longevity is \$0.14 hourly totaling \$43.10. Per county policy with a promotion from a Sergeant's wage to Captain's wage would be a 7.5% increase bringing him in at \$46.34 which would be between steps 7 and 8. This is an exempt position with no overtime or longevity. This position provides supervision and advice around the clock.

Sheriff Riggs recommendation is to bringing Captain Kleszyk in at Pay Grade 15 step 8 at \$46.87 with \$400 a month as availability pay. This will take effect March 1, 2023.

A motion was made by Commissioner Gaasvig, and seconded by Commissioner Carlson, to place Captain Joe Kleszyk at Pay Grade 15, Step 8 which is \$46.87/hour plus \$400/month as availability pay, effective March 1, 2023. Unanimously carried.

Morrison County Contract for Jail Beds

The Beltrami County Sheriff's Office has an opportunity to secure (20) male bed spaces at the Morrison County Sheriff's Office Jail at a rate of \$55.00 a day per inmate. The contract secures the space for a portion of our budgeted out of county housing at a rate that is lower than the MN DOC rate of \$65.00 per inmate per

day. This is the current rate that most jails that are taking out of county housing are adopting.

A motion was made by Commissioner Carlson, and seconded by Commissioner Gaasvig, to approve the Contract with Morrison County for twenty male inmate beds at a rate of \$55/day per inmate. Unanimously carried.

Township Road Maintenance Agreement and Rates

Highway Engineer, Bruce Hasbargen presented that the annual township road maintenance rates he is proposing for approval:

- Blading \$1,000/mile annually
- Snowplowing gravel \$1200/mile annually
- Snowplowing paved \$2,000/mile annually
- Both Blading & Snowplowing gravel \$2,000/mile annually

These rates would go into effect with the new maintenance agreements with any township wanting County Highway Department services as listed. These rates would then update the County Wide Fee Schedule.

County Attorney, David Hanson confirmed, approval of these rates would approve the concept of the Road Maintenance Agreement, but a final review would be made, and individual Agreements with Townships would be before the Board for approval as they occur.

A motion was made by Commissioner Carlson and seconded by Commissioner Gaasvig, to approve the annual rates for road blading and snowplowing as proposed, and the Road Maintenance Agreement in concept. Motion carried 3:1. Commissioner Sumner vote: No.

CITIZENS ADDRESSING THE BOARD

- Nancy Beaulieu, resident in District 1 spoke to the Board about Treaty Rights and responsibilities of Treaty People. She is working on a plan to host a Treaty 101 Summit and would like to have Commissioners Sumner and Gould participate in the planning.
- Dan Lossing, Langor Township Supervisor spoke to the Highway Department road maintenance fees for 2023, which represent a very large increase over the current \$198/mile they are now paying.
- Jerome Geerdes, Birch Township Chairman, stated that Birch Twp has about 3.5-4 miles of road bladed and plowed by the County. Last year the bill was \$4,371. Under the new rates, it will cost \$11,464 for the same service.
- Jerry Winans, Roosevelt Township Treasurer, stated the 5 year average for plowing, grading and mowing of about 10.4 miles cost them about \$11,280/year. Under the new rates, it would cost \$20,000 for the plowing and grading alone.
- Scott Burns, Birch Township Supervisor, stated his concern that the cost increase is too much for townships to adjust for all at once and under such short notice. Requested consideration of a more reasonable increase and more time to adjust and budget.
- Pat Kovar, Hines Township Supervisor, stated that Hines Twp has about 12 miles of roads plowed by the County. Last year it cost \$8,600. Under the new rates, it will be \$14,400.

Private Sale of Tax-Forfeited Parcels Resolution

These small acreages are encroachments on tax-forfeited land and when sold will resolve the situation (the adjacent land owners paid for the professional survey). The parcels were reviewed by the NRM Department, Townships, MN DNR, the County Interdepartmental Review, and the Land Review Committee. The Committee recommended to move forward with the sale process and offer these parcels for private sale.

The NRM Department recommends selling these small acreages to resolve long-standing encroachment situations and Board approval of the Resolution to authorize:

WHEREAS, Chapter 282.01 to 282.12, Minnesota Statutes 1941, as amended, provides for the classification and sale of such lands forfeited to the State for delinquent taxes, and whereas such classification has been made by the County Board and the classification by the governing body of the municipality in which they lie in so far as the lands located within said town or municipality are concerned; and, WHEREAS, The County Board has made appraisal of such lands as provided by law, and a list of such lands has been filed with the County Auditor for the purpose of offering such lands for sale at not less than their appraised value; and,

WHEREAS, Said parcels were approved for sale by the respective townships and the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Beltrami County Tax-Forfeited Sale Review Nos. 04-21-03, 04-22-02, and 04-23-01 respectively; and,

WHEREAS, The County Board is by law designated with authority to provide for the sale of such lands on terms and whereas the County Board has considered the advisability of selling on terms and has considered the accessibility of such lands, their proximity to existing public improvements and the effect of their sale and occupancy on the public burdens; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That such parcels shall be sold on the following terms, to-wit: That all sales shall be paid in full in cash by 4:30 pm on Wednesday, March 29, 2023. Special assessments and the appraised price of any standing timber or timber products must be paid for in cash at the time of the sale; and in the case any parcel of land bearing standing timber or timber products is sold at public auction for more than the appraised value, the amount bid in excess of the appraised value shall be allocated between the land and the timber in proportion to the respective original appraised values thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Commissioners of Beltrami County, Minnesota, may provide for the subdivision of a tract into smaller units when the subdivision is deemed advantageous for conveyance or sale purposes in accordance with Minnesota Statutes 282.01, Subd. 1(e);

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That all purchasers of land shall pay 3 percent surcharge of the total sale price to be paid into the state assurance account as provided by Chapter 383, Laws of 1969, a state deed fee of \$25.00, a deed filing fee of \$46.00, and a state deed tax equal to the greater of \$1.65 or 0.33% of the basic sale price.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That where any lands herein offered for sale do not adjoin or are not located on a suitable legally established and maintained public highway or road, the township wherein said lands may be located, nor any other municipality shall not for a period of five years be obligated to the establishment, construction or additional maintenance of any public roads or the expenditure of any public funds for the benefit of the owner or occupant of any lands herein purchased by reason of the ownership

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or occupancy of any of this land; provided further, that nothing herein shall be construed to create any obligation, directly or indirectly, on the part of any municipality for the expenditure of any money for the benefit of said parcel after the expiration of said five-year period. WHEREAS, the Minnesota Attorney General has signed on to multistate settlement agreements with several opioid supply chain participants, but those settlement agreements are still subject to sign-on by local governments and final agreement by the companies and approval by the courts; and

WHEREAS, there is a deadline of April, 18 2023, for a sufficient threshold of Minnesota cities and counties to sign on to the above-referenced multistate settlement agreements, and failure to timely sign on may diminish the amount of funds received by not only that city or county but by all Minnesota cities and counties from the settlement funds; and

WHEREAS, representatives of Minnesota's local governments, the Office of the Attorney General, and the State of Minnesota have reached agreement on the intrastate allocation of these settlement funds between the State, and the counties and cities, as well as the permissible uses of these funds, which will be memorialized in the Minnesota Opioids State-Subdivision

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Memorandum of Agreement, as amended (the "State-Subdivision Agreement"); and

HHS Housing Trust Fund

Social Services Division Director, Jeff Lind presented the plan from Health and Human Services for the management of the Homelessness Prevention Grant Funds received from the State.

Beltrami County Health and Human Services is requesting that the Beltrami County Board authorize the development of a Beltrami County Housing Trust Fund. This request includes the development of a County Ordinance authorizing said Trust Fund, and the development of and RFP to identify the Holder of the Trust. Once the Trust is established and is held by an organization, Beltrami County Health and Human Services would develop a process by which to access these funds.

These funds (\$710,746 in year one of a five-year allocation) were designated to the prevention of homelessness in children and young adults and their usage are outlined in the Homeless Prevention Aid Statute 4 77 A.30. Any usage of these funds will have to comply with the pertaining statute.

Usage of the funds would include at least one of the following, Rental Assistance/Housing case management. The Trust would also be developed to spur the development of additional low to moderate income/workforce housing stock, as well as other identified uses. Beltrami County is experiencing a significant housing shortage and the development of a Housing Trust Fund is seen as one option to spur the growth of housing stock in our County.

A motion was made by Commissioner Carlson, and seconded by Commissioner Sumner, to approve the development of a County Ordinance to direct the process of establishment of a Beltrami County Housing Trust Fund. Unanimously carried.

Taxpayer Services Division

Auditor-Treasurer, JoDee Treat reviewed the request for reorganization in the Auditor-Treasurer' Office:

A presentation was made to the Commissioners at the April 18, 2023 Work Session, that outlined the reorganization of the Auditor-Treasurer's Office. Prior to 2016 the Auditor-Treasurer's Office was made up of Real Estate & Tax Division, License Center Division and Finance.

To finance this endeavor, NACo and WIR are looking for a voluntary investment of \$15 million over the next two years nationally. To that end, NACo and WIR are requesting a contribution of \$3,979 for Beltrami County over the next two years. This amount represents 1% of what the County receives.

A motion was made by Commissioner Sumner, and seconded by Commissioner Gould, to approve contribution of \$3,979 over the next two years to the National Center for Public Lands Counties. The motion was amended to include the funding source as LATCF dollars. Motion carried unanimously.

Kay Mack, resident on Carr Lake Road and member of the Battered Women's Shelter Board suggested some language be included in the Ordinance to allow for transitional housing projects to be eligible for funding through the Housing Trust Fund. Specifically:

- Section 2.1
 - o Add: "or transitional shelter" to the definition
- Section 4.2 Trust Fund Distributions
 - o Add aftercreation of Assisted Units "and transitional shelters".

At 5:38 pm a motion was made by Commissioner Gould and seconded by Commissioner Sumner to close the public hearing.

A motion was made by Commissioner Sumner and seconded by Commissioner Carlson to approve the Housing Trust Fund Ordinance with the two changes suggested to include "transitional shelters" in Sections 2.1 and 4.2. Unanimously carried.

Clearwater River Restoration & Enhancement Project

Environmental Services Director, Brent Rud informed the Board that the proposed project was not approved by Buzzle Township and therefore, will not proceed. The County will not be seeking a resolution of support and all unused grant funding will be returned.

CAD/RMS and Mobile Data Agreement

Sheriff Riggs updated the Board on the Agreement that was drafted between the Beltrami County Sheriff's Office and the Bemidji Police Department around CAD/RMS and Mobile Data systems, process and procedure. The agreement is in line with what is currently being practiced and is in alignment with both organizations. The City of Bemidji has already approved the Agreement.

WHEREAS, The County Board is by law designated with authority to provide for the sale of such lands on terms and whereas the County Board has considered the advisability of selling on terms and has considered the accessibility of such lands, their proximity to existing public improvements and the effect of their sale and occupancy on the public burdens; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, This parcel shall be sold on the following terms, to-wit: submission of 1% of the final sale amount as a bid guarantee by 4:30 pm on Tuesday August 22, 2023 and, that all sales shall be paid in full in cash by 4:30 pm on September 18, 2023. Special assessments and the appraised price of any standing timber or timber products must be paid for in cash at the time of the sale; and in the case any parcel of land bearing standing timber or timber products is sold at auction for more than the appraised value, the amount bid in excess of the appraised value shall be allocated between the land and the timber in proportion to the respective original appraised values thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That all purchasers of land shall pay 3 percent surcharge of the total sale price to be paid Minnesota Management and Budget, a state deed fee of \$25.00, a deed filing fee of \$46.00, and a state deed tax equal to the greater of \$1.65 or 0.33% of the basic sale price.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That where any lands herein offered for sale do not adjoin or are not located on a suitable legally established and maintained public highway or road, the township wherein said lands may be located, nor any other municipality shall not for a period of five years be obligated to the establishment, construction or additional maintenance of any public roads or the expenditure of any public funds for the benefit of the owner or occupant of any lands herein purchased by reason of the ownership or occupancy of any of this land; provided further, that nothing herein shall be construed to create any obligation, directly or indirectly, on the part of any municipality for the expenditure of any money for the benefit of said parcel after the expiration of said five-year period. Responsibility for determining boundary lines of parcels purchased rests with the purchaser.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the right is reserved in the interest of the public to withdraw from sale, any parcel, at any time prior to its sale.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That all lands sold hereunder are sold subject to any ordinances adopted by the County Board, and all

lands are sold subject to railroad and highway easements, power and pipeline easements, and subject to all flowage rights, and

Jail Project Siting Criteria

In February of 2023, the County's Design and Operations Subcommittee developed a rating and ranking system for proposed jail sites as a selection guide and applied the system to more Beltrami County Board of Commissioners Meeting Minutes

than 15 properties identified in its work. After the Board selected and announced a location for the new County Jail, it conducted a Public Hearing to gather input from the community. After hearing concerns and suggestions from community members, the County's Design and Operations Subcommittee revised the siting criteria item 9. Neighborhood impact; to expand a buffer area to 1000 ft. to be included in evaluating impact. They disqualified all current sites affected by the GBAJPB moratorium placed on jails in a residential zone for six months, and added a few more locations for consideration; then re-rated and ranked all potential locations.

At the conclusion of this process, the revised site selection scoring and ranking came down to the following 7 possibilities:

- 1. BRIC Property
- 2. Industrial Park
- 3. Quello Property
- 4. Old Fairgrounds/Target
- 5. Nymore/Crown Property
- 6. Hanson Property
- 7. Pinnacle Village

Any and all property negotiations will be conducted in Closed Session. Once a purchase is made, the County will disclose the property and price.

It was recommended by Administrator Barry, that if the Board wishes to proceed with looking at and making offers on any other properties in a timely fashion, they should rescind their offer on the Wiebolt Property.

A motion was made by Commissioner Carlson and seconded by Commissioner Anderson to withdraw the purchase agreement on the Wiebolt property and be refunded the \$10,000 earnest money and extend authorization to the County Administrator to pursue properties in the industrial and business zones where a jail would be allowed and bring back to the Board a sale/purchase agreement for approval. Unanimously carried.

Administrator Barry stated in response to questions regarding negotiations with any of the seven sites in securing a fare and reasonable price; it is the hopes that a reasonable offer could be made and accepted, however the Board would always have the option of Eminent Domain by which they could condemn and acquire a property at fair market value.

Opioid Settlement

A motion was made by Commissioner Gaasvig, and seconded by Commissioner Carlson, to approve the formation of the Opioid

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Settlement Steering Committee, approval of the Steering Committee Guiding Document, the appointment of Commissioner Sumner to the Steering Committee, with any other Commissioner as an alternate, adding this Committee to the per diem committee list, appoint up to 15 total members to the Steering Committee and moving all Opioid Settlement presentations to the Beltrami County Board Work Sessions and/or Regular Meetings. Unanimously carried.

PrimeWest Reinvestment Funds

Health & Human Services Director, Anne Lindseth had reviewed four areas where they would like to spend the reinvestment funds.

Members of the Board discussed the desire to receive more background information and other possible options for spending funds.

A motion was made by Commissioner Gould to approve the four options and dollar amounts for disbursement of the PrimeWest Reinvestment Funds designated to Health and Human Services. This motion died for lack of a second.

A motion was made by Commissioner Gaasvig and seconded by Commissioner Carlson to table the PrimeWest Reinvestment Fund disbursement until the August 1, 2023 Regular Board Meeting. Carried 4:1. Commissioner Gould voted No.

Joint Airport Zoning Board (JAZB) Update

Resolution Supporting the Joint Airport Zoning Board:

WHEREAS, the City Bemidji and Beltrami County established the initial Joint Airport Zoning Board in 1973; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bemidji and Beltrami County subsequently entered into a Joint Powers Agreement for the joint maintenance and operation of what is now known as the Bemidji Regional Airport; and

WHEREAS, portions of the airport hazard area adjacent to the Bemidji Regional Airport ("the Airport") are located outside the territorial limits of the City of Bemidji but within the territorial limits of Beltrami County, Northern Township, Bemidji Township, Eckles Township, Grant Valley Township, and the City of Wilton, MN; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bemidji and Beltrami County have deemed it necessary and expedient to revisit and revise the Joint Airport Zoning Board ("JAZB") in cooperation with, among others, Beltrami County, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 360.063, Subdivision 3, and other applicable laws, for the purpose of revising, administering, and enforcing zoning laws for the areas surrounding the Airport and for the protection of the Airport and the public; and

WHEREAS, in 2022 the JAZB was revised to be comprised of the City of Bemidji, City of Wilton, Northern Township, Bemidji Township, Grant Valley Township, Eckles Township, and Beltrami County; and

WHEREAS, Beltrami County appointed representation to the JAZB, who have ensured the interests of Beltrami County are heard; and

WHEREAS, since its 2022 revision, the JAZB has been meeting and working together regularly to revise the Bemidji Regional Airport Zoning Ordinance to better protect the public, the Airport, and member communities; and

WHEREAS, the JAZB has now developed a draft zoning ordinance to submit to the State of Minnesota Department of Transportation ("MNDoT") for approval; and

WHEREAS, upon MNDoT approval of the draft Ordinance, the JAZB will move forward with passing the ordinance with any MNDoT required

revisions and is now seeking support from JAZB member communities; and

WHEREAS, Beltrami County, having received a copy of the proposed JAZB Ordinance, and having reviewed said Ordinance, agrees it is in the best interest of the Airport and the surrounding communities that it be approved and adopted;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Beltrami County is in support of the proposed Bemidji Regional Airport Zoning Ordinance.

A motion was made Commissioner Gaasvig, and seconded by Commissioner Carlson, to approve the Resolution of Support for the draft JAZB Zoning Ordinance. Unanimously carried.

Resolution and Ballot Language for LOST

The Minnesota Legislature has approved the County's request to place a question on the ballot asking residents whether they wanted a LOST to finance the new County Jail. State Statute requires the Board approve a resolution and ballot language to facilitate the vote:

Resolution Authorizing the Jail Local Option Sales Tax Cote and approving Ballot Language:

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Department of Corrections issued a Notice of Deficiency and has required substantial investments in the current Beltrami County Jail; and

WHEREAS, the Beltrami County Board ("Board"), by resolution, committed to address the deficiencies and work towards long term solutions to mitigate the deficiencies; and

WHEREAS, the Board commissioned a Needs Assessment and Feasibility Study and approved moving forward with the design and construction of a new jail on November 15, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Beltrami County ("the County") has completed the planning process to replace the current 34-year-old County jail; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota LAWS 2023, Chapter 64, Article 10, Section 25 ("the Special Law") authorizes the County to impose by ordinance a sales and use tax of five-eighths of one percent ("0.625%") to pay the costs of collecting and administering the tax, and to finance up to \$80,000,000, plus associated bonding costs, for the construction of a new jail; and

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WHEREAS, the Special Law is effective the day after (a) the County Board of Commissioners approves the Special Law by resolution, and (b) the County Administrator files with the Minnesota Secretary of State a certificate of valid approval, including a copy of the resolution of approval; and

WHEREAS, Minn. Stat. § 297A.99 Subdivision 3 requires that imposition of a local sales tax is subject to approval by voters of the County at a general election within the two-year period after the County has received authority to impose the tax; and

WHEREAS, Minn. Stat. § 205.16 requires that the County Administrator provide to the County Auditor written notice of a ballot question which the County Auditor will submit to the State - including the title and language of the question - on or before a date at least 74 days prior to the election, which is on or before August 25, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the County's legal counsel has approved the ballot question wording; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Board of Commissioners approves the Special Law;

AND BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Administrator is directed to file the necessary certificate with the Minnesota Secretary or State;

AND BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Administrator is directed to notify the County Auditor to place the ballot question on the November 7, 2023 ballot before August 25, 2023;

AND BE IT RESOLVED, that the appropriate County officials are authorized and directed to take all necessary steps to place this ballot question on the November 7, 2023 general election ballot;

AND BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the County Board of Commissioners adopts the title and language of the ballot question as follows:

Question Title: BELTRAMI COUNTY JAIL SALES TAX

The Beltrami County Board of Commissioners has voted to construct a new County Jail at an estimated cost of \$80 million. Taxpayers have a choice as to how to fund the project. Shall Beltrami County establish a five-eighths of one percent (0.625%) sales and use tax to pay for constructing and financing the new jail?

A YES vote means that the majority of the costs would be financed through the sales and use tax which would remain in effect for 30 years or until the bonds are retired, whichever comes first.

A NO vote means that the majority of the costs would be financed through increased property taxes for 30 years or until the bonds are retired, whichever comes first.

A motion was made by Commissioner Carlson, and seconded by Commissioner Gould, to approve the Resolution Authorizing the Jail Local Option Sales Tax Vote and approving Ballot Language. Unanimously carried.

Jail Steering Committee Appointment

Administrator Barry reported to the Board, that the Bemidji Mayor, who sits on the Jail Steering Committee, has requested an alternate be identified to serve on his behalf when needed. The Bemidji City Council has identified Lynn Eaton as the Mayor's alternate and is recommending Mr. Eaton serve in that capacity when the Mayor feels there is a conflict of interest.

Members of the Board agreed that they were not in support of an alternate on the Jail Steering Committee.

CLOSED SESSION - Property Negotiations

A motion was made by Commissioner Sumner, and seconded by Commissioner Gould, to go into closed session at 5:35 pm. Unanimously carried.

A motion was made by Commissioner Carlson, and seconded by Commissioner Sumner, to hold a Special Meeting with a Closed Session, on Monday, August 7, 2023 to finalize a purchase agreement for a Jail Project Property. Unanimously carried.

A motion was made by Commissioner Carlson and seconded by Commissioner Sumner, to hold a Public Hearing on August 15, 2023 to gather citizen input on the new Jail Project location. Unanimously carried.

WHEREAS, currently, there are 32 species on the State prohibited noxious weed list - 16 on the prohibited-eradicate list and 16 on the prohibited-control list. These species must be eradicated or controlled on all lands within the state;

WHEREAS, efforts must be made to prevent the spread, maturation, and dispersal of any propagating parts, thereby reducing established populations and preventing reproduction and spread as required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 18.78.

WHEREAS, Beltrami County tax-forfeited lands harbor many noxious weeds currently on the Noxious Weed Prohibited Control list, especially Spotted Knapweed, Common Tansy, Canada Thistle, Leafy Spurge, and common buckthorn which is on the Restricted Noxious Weed list;

WHEREAS, the Beltrami County Natural Resource Management (NRM) Department has the opportunity to apply for a 2024 Minnesota Department of Agriculture Noxious Weed and Invasive Plant Grant for \$5,000 to help control noxious weeds;

WHEREAS, the in-kind amount would be provided by existing NRM Department employee personnel costs and travel costs to the project sites;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners authorizes the Land Commissioner to apply to the Noxious Weed and Invasive Plant Program Grant to help fund biological control measures, herbicide application on plants, and a field and brush mower to use on the State Prohibited Control and Restricted Noxious Weed Lists. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Beltrami County Sheriff's Office, of Beltrami County hereby declares that the position, Permanent Part-time Court Deputy, currently held by Tyler Summers meets all of the following Police and Fire Plan membership requirements: Said position requires a license by the Minnesota peace officer standards and training board under sections 626.84 to 626.863 and this employee is so licensed;
 Said position's primary (over 50%) duty is to enforce the general criminal laws of the state;
 Said position charges this employee with the prevention and detection of crime;
 Said position gives this employee the full power of arrest, and
 Said position is assigned to a designated police or sheriff's department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this governing body hereby requests that the named Employee be accepted as a member of the Public Employees Police and Fire Plan effective the date of this employee's initial Police and Fire Plan salary deduction by the governmental subdivision.

REGULAR AGENDA

<u>Mail Box Supports Update and Grant Application</u> Highway Engineer, Bruce Hasbargen, discussed the issues with improper mail box supports throughout the County.

The Federal Highway Safety Improvement Program is a potential funding Source to help address all non-conforming mailboxes. It has a 10% match requirement. CSAH construction funds would cover the match on CSAH routes and local dollars would cover the match on County roads.

Engineers recommendation is to update the County Policy to require swing away style supports on CSAH and County roads for any new installations, and proceed with the Grant Application.

Members of the Board are in support of proceeding with the Grant Application at this time.

Set Public Hearing Date for Right-of-Way Reversion to Township Highway Engineer, Bruce Hasbargen addressed the Board regarding two right of ways along CSAH 22 that are no longer needed, nor will be needed in the future. Mr. Hasbargen is suggesting the roads (right of ways) be reverted to the townships; Turtle Lake and Port Hope, who could then vacate the roads (right of way).

This process will require public hearings in each of the two townships. Suggestion is for October or later to hold the hearing. Engineer was directed to coordinate with the Townships on scheduling dates for Public Hearings.

Highway Grant Opportunities

Highway Engineer, Bruce Hasbargen, reviewed several Grant Opportunities the Highway Department would like to pursue:

- Development of a pedestrian/bike trail along Division St, has potential grant opportunities that require 20% match.
 a. The Board was not in support of this opportunity
- State Grant to provide 100% funding for specific project, grant was new last year, we did not get our project approved. Would like to try another this year.

a. The Board was in favor of this opportunity

3. The City of Tenstrike has an opportunity to apply for a Local Road Improvement Program grant, prior to a potential route exchange with the County

a. The Board was in favor of this opportunity

4. MnDOT District 2 is soliciting for projects for a new funding program. Potential opportunity for Lakewood Drive project. Does require a 20% match.

a. The Board was in favor of this opportunity

Jail Project Realty Services Reimbursement

The County engaged with Century 21 Dickison Realtors to assist in the research, evaluation, negotiation and eventual acquisition of a suitable property for the County Jail Project. Many properties were evaluated, and several negotiations and contracts developed. In the end, the County accepted a property that was donated. As such, there was no commission available to compensate the Realtor's. The realtors submitted an activity log from March 14 through August 24, 2023 and are seeking compensation.

A motion was made by Commissioner Sumner, to compensate Century 21 Dickinson Realty \$26,000 for services related to the jail project site selection. Motion died for lack of a second.

A motion was made by Commissioner Carlson, and seconded by Commissioner Gaasvig, to compensate Century 21 Dickinson Realty \$10,000 for services related to the jail project site selection. Motion carried 3:2. Commissioners Gould and Sumner voted No.

Regular Meeting Schedule Modification for November 7

The County will be holding a Special Election on the Local Sales Tax for the Jail Project on November 7th. This coincides with the regularly scheduled board meeting. Staff is requesting the Board discuss whether it would like to avoid issues with the requirement that the board meeting be required to close by 6 pm due to the special election and move the regular meeting to November 14, or some other date.

Commissioners were support of moving the November 7 Regularly scheduled Board Meeting & Work Sessions to November 14.

Opioid Settlement Funding Allocations

A motion was made by Commissioner Gaasvig and seconded by Commissioner Carlson, to approve the minimum annual funding allocations from the Opioid Settlement Fund to: 10% Administrative; 15% correctional RESET Program; and 15% to youth services, education and training throughout the County. Unanimously carried.

FY 2024 Preliminary Budget

Administrator, Tom Barry, provided a preliminary budget recap and distributed Budget Book to Commissioners for review.

Budget highlights included:

- 2024 budget is at \$104M
- Proposed Levy is 6.65%
- ARPA Funding will be at \$900,000 remaining balance
- Proposed Budget and Levy approval required by September 30th
- Public Hearing will be scheduled for December 12
- Final Budget & Levy approved on December 19

Public Hearing: Judicial Ditch 18

The majority of the ditch has previously been abandoned. Letters were sent to property owners on the process to be removed from the ditch system. One property Owner has submitted a petition for removal. Highway Engineer, Bruce Hasbargen is recommending the Board remove the property petitioned for, from Judicial Ditch 18.

Resolution of Support for Beltrami County Correctional Facility The County submitted a Capital Bonding Request for the 2024 Legislative Session. Administrator Barry informed the Board that the Capital Budget Office has requested an updated resolution of support for the application:

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WHEREAS, the Minnesota Department of Corrections issued a Notice of Deficiency and has required substantial investments in the current Beltrami County Correctional Facility; and

WHEREAS, the Beltrami County Board, by previous resolution, committed to address the deficiencies and work towards long term solutions to mitigate the deficiencies; and

WHEREAS, the Beltrami County Board commissioned a Needs Assessment and Feasibility Study and approved moving forward with the design and construction of a new Correctional Facility on November 15, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Beltrami County has completed the planning process to replace the current 34-year-old County Correctional Facility; and

WHEREAS, Beltrami County is home to more than 46,000 people across 2,509 square miles of land and serves as a geographic center and economic hub for Northwestern Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, Beltrami County includes two Native American Sovereign Nations whose population are disproportionately represented in the County Correctional Facility; and

WHEREAS, the new Beltrami County Correctional Facility will focus on providing cultural, spiritual, mental health, chemical dependency treatment and transitional programing to reduce recidivism and break the incarceration cycle; and WHEREAS, the new Beltrami County Correctional Facility will serve a wide range of Northern Minnesota local, county, state, and federal agencies; and

WHEREAS, the new Beltrami County Correctional Facility will enhance the public safety of Beltrami County and the cities of Bemidji, Blackduck, Funkley, Hines, Kelliher, Pennington, Ponemah, Puposky, Redby, Redlake, Solway, Tenstrike, Waskish, and Wilton as well as the surrounding counties and jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, Beltrami County has requested State Bonding dollars by submission of a 2024 Capital Budget Request to assist in the design and construction of the new Correctional Facility; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Legislature is presently considering 2024 State bonding legislation through its capital budgeting process, which may appropriate funds for the construction of the Beltrami County Correctional Facility; and

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WHEREAS, Beltrami County is the 2nd poorest county in the State with a poverty rate of 20% and the 3rd largest county in Minnesota with a large service area and a very small net tax capacity (only 1/3 of properties in the County are taxable); and

WHEREAS, the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners has designated the Beltrami County Correctional Facility Replacement Project its highest priority; and

WHEREAS, the Beltrami County Correctional Facility Project will be the largest and most expensive and complex capital construction project ever undertaken in the County's 100+ year history; and

WHEREAS, without significant financial assistance from the State of Minnesota design and construction of the Beltrami County Correctional Facility will be an incredible financial hardship for Beltrami County and its citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Beltrami County Commission Chair and County Commissioners do hereby designate the Beltrami County Correctional Facility a Regionally Significant Project and fully support its design and construction;

AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Beltrami County Commission affirm that local resources or other nonstate funds will be contributing to the project;

AND, BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Beltrami County Commission encourages the Minnesota Legislature to dedicate 2024 State capital budget funding toward the Beltrami County Correctional Facility project.

2024 Agricultural Lease Rates

Per the 2019 Beltrami County Agricultural Lease Policy, the Agricultural lease rates are set at 2.5% of land value and reviewed by the County Board of Commissioners. The current 2023 agricultural lease rate is \$24.50/acre/year.

The NRM Department received estimated market values per acre from the County Assessor's office for all the parcels where agricultural leases are located. A 2.5% lease rate of the estimated market value would be greater than \$31.00/acre/year. In order to keep the rates somewhat in line with policy, the NRM Department recommends an increase from the current lease rate of \$24.50/acre to \$26.25/acre (2.2% of estimated land value) for 2024. This would be a 7.1% increase from 2023. All agricultural leases are taxed per State Statute and at estimated fair market value.

NRM realizes Beltrami County is below the policy standard but recommends the County Board approve the suggested incremental lease rate increase to keep the County close to policy. the estimate, and will return any amount appropriated for the project but not required. The proper county officers are authorized to execute a grant agreement and any amendments thereto with the Commissioner of Transportation concerning the above-referenced grant.

REGULAR AGENDA

Natural Resource Management Land Purchase

The Natural Resource Management and County Attorney Departments are seeking Board approval to purchase approximately 1.62 acres from Glenn and Marie Bridgeford to gain all-season access to large parcels of County owned land south of CR 21 and approval for Auditor/Treasurer to issue payment to the Bridgeford's in the amount of \$3,726.

A motion was made by Commissioner Carlson, and seconded by Commissioner Gaasvig, to approve the purchase of 1.62 acres from the Bridgefords, located south of CR 21 and specified in the survey, for the amount of \$3,726. Unanimously carried.

Involuntary Hold Contract and MOA with Sanford Health

Per MN Statute 253B.04 Sub. 2 and MN Statute 245.469 County Health and Human Service agencies are required to provide, or contract to provide, a qualified facility for involuntary hold placements.

As there lacked a written contract to this point an MOA and release of claims between Beltrami County and Sanford Health of Northern MN was developed. This MOA memorializes the agreed upon fee for costs incurred up to the point the involuntary hold contract is finalized.

A motion was made by Commissioner Carlson, and seconded by Commissioner Gould, to approve the Involuntary Hold Contract and the MOA with Sanford Health of Northern, MN. Unanimously carried.

Commissioner Salaries Resolution

Commissioner's salaries reflect the same increases as awarded to all union and non union employees. A 2024 COLA adjustment of 3% will take effect on January 1, 2024 resulting in a total annual Commissioner salary of \$35,844.34.

WHEREAS, the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners is responsible for setting compensation of county employees, elected officials, appointed officials and board members; and

WHEREAS, the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners considered the duties and responsibilities of each individual position; and

WHEREAS, the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners considered the salaries of elected officials in other comparable counties;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners approve setting the County Commissioners salary at \$35,844.34 annually, excluding per diem payments, for the calendar year 2024.

A motion was made by Commissioner Gaasvig, and seconded by Commissioner Carlson, to approve the 2024 Commissioner's salary of \$35,844.34. Unanimously carried.

Commissioner Per Diem Resolution

The per diem rates included below are the same as 2023. Committees listed on the resolution are the only committees eligible for per diem. If a Commissioner has accepted a committee assignment that is not included in the resolution, no per diem can be paid per MS 375.055.
