Access

• Firm or Frozen – Operations may be conducted whenever the site is frozen or when dry and firm to prevent site impacts. There is a wetland crossing that will need frost or equipment mats.

• Latitude/Longitude - Primary access location is Lat. 47.61N, by Long. 94.82W.

• Hauling Consideration - County Road 22 (Island View Drive) is scheduled for a construction project in 2026. This could make hauling difficult. Logger should consider contacting Highway Department prior to opening sale during road construction season.

Cutting and Skidding

 Logging Damage - Logging damage is injury to 30% or more of the crown; or bark damage exposing cambium of 50 sq.in. or more; or damage causing lean of more than 5 degrees from original. Damage to reserve trees, as identified on the Appraisal form, may be subject to a \$25/tree penalty

 Progressive Skidding Pattern – Use a progressive skidding pattern to avoid damage to residual trees and soil compaction which happens when re-skidding through an area.

• Reserve tree cutting penalty - Cutting any marked or designated leave tree without pre-approval by the Forester may be subject to a \$50.00/tree penalty. On area estimate sales, reserve trees approved for cutting by the Forester must be measured or field scaled for billing at contract rates.

Skid Trail percent limits – Keep primary and secondary skid trails to <10-15% of timber harvest.

• Stay within Boundaries - Unless approved in advance by the Forester, all harvest activities shall be confined to within the marked boundary. Access roads, skid trails and landing areas proposed for use outside the harvest boundary must be approved prior to use. Failure to comply with these requirements may be subject to a \$100 penalty per incident.

Stumps – Average stump heights below 12" and as low as possible.

Harvest and Reserves

Boundary Blue Paint - leave all painted trees. Boundary adjacent to private land in some places.

Den Trees – Reserve trees with obvious den and cavity usage, even if not marked to leave.

• Leave Trees: Oak unless severely dying. All Cedar. Pine unless dying and marketable.

• Leave Trees: Logger may choose to leave smaller maple, birch, and basswood if healthy, good form, and undamaged.

Cut Trees: All Aspen, Balm, Ash, Balsam and Spruce, and mature hardwoods except Oak.

Landings, Access Roads, and Skid Trails

Landings Approved – Landing locations must be approved in advance by the Forester. Sale plan includes two landings

Other Remarks

The Highway Department is planning a construction project for 2026 that could affect timber sale access. Logger may want to check with Highway Department if opening during road construction season.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

• Rutting - Contractor must be prepared to shut down equipment operations or hauling if thawing or wet conditions create the potential for rutting. Failure to comply with this requirement may be subject to a \$100 penalty per occurrence.

Slash Disposal

Slash Scattered - Lop and Scatter all slash to within 2 feet of ground unless making slash piles for wildlife.

Tree Size, Marketing, and Special Conditions

4 inch TDIB – Utilize all material from butt to a 4" top diameter inside bark.

• No excess culling - Cutting long Butts or oversize tops to produce higher quality product must be done to retain marketable lengths of lower value pulp or firewood. Culling which leaves excessive amounts of wood in unmarketable lengths may be subject to a \$10.00 per piece penalty, unless the material is loaded and hauled off site based upon an estimated cord volume.

• Private Wood – There is a strip of private wood along part of the sale boundary that is NOT part of this sale. If the landowner sells this wood to you, to comply with Chain of Custody requirements of our certifying organization, the private wood must not be mixed or hauled with the County wood.




