Local Opioid Timeline

- Early 2000 2010, rise in prescription pills
- 2014-2015, Heroin is increasingly found in area
- 2016-2018, Fentanyl is rumored to be in the area, found to be "cut" into heroin
- 2019-2020, Fentanyl becomes more prevalent, becoming the main opioid in are
- 2021-Present, Fentanyl is king, Heroin is hard to find.

Opioid Trends

- Potency is high
- There is no "normal" looking heroin or fentanyl
- Heroin has been nearly replaced by Fentanyl
- Sold in fraction of a gram up to pounds
- 45% of Mbox pills have potentially lethal dose.
- Future is dire, as the recipe is similar to methamphetamine

For the year ending December 31, 2022, the PBDTF seized and purchased:

A combined total of 25,452 grams (56 pounds) of Methamphetamine, having a street value of \$1.9 Million

A combined total of 3,196 grams (7 pounds) of Heroin/Fentanyl, having a street value of \$594K

A combined total of 3,843(8.4 pounds) of Cocaine, having an estimated street value of \$392K

Total street value of Methamphetamine, Heroin/Fentanyl, Cocaine, \$2.85 Million

90 firearms were seized

26 children were removed from endangerment

Overdoses

The human body has opioid receptors in several different areas, including the brain, central and peripheral nervous systems, and the gastrointestinal tract. When someone uses an opioid, these receptors are activated and slow the body down. When the body becomes overwhelmed by opioids, all of these receptors are blocked, and the it can't perform other functions.

3rd Degree Murder Prosecution in Beltrami County

- In Minnesota, a person who causes the death of a human being by providing them with a controlled substance is guilty of 3rd Degree Murder.
- Cases require a lot of time and resources, they are indeed a murder investigation and are treated as such.
- In 2023, there have been three individuals convicted of 3rd Degree Murder in Beltrami County, two more are progressing through the court system.
- The last conviction for this prior top 2022 came in 2009.
